RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS UNDER THIS SECTION

1. All entries must be home grown by the exhibitor except in arrangement division, where noted.
2. **ONLY ONE ENTRY PER PERSON IN ANY ONE LOT WILL BE ALLOWED.**
3. All exhibits must meet requirements of the premium list or they will be disqualified.
4. The superintendent has the right to dispose of any specimens showing signs of severe wilting, spoilage or damage.
5. No awards will be made where exhibits are below standards of showmanship and quality.
6. **Entries must NOT be removed before 5:00 p.m. on Sunday July 28. Any exhibits removed before specified time will result in forfeiture of premium.**
7. Containers are supplied for most specimens. The Fair Association will not be held responsible for loss of private vases, baskets, etc. If you bring a hosta specimen, bring it in your own plain container, in scale with the size of your hosta leaf.
8. A specimen cannot be entered in the lot "Any Other" if there is a class listed for that category. Specimens entered in "Any Other" lot need to be labeled to be judged.
9. Lots will be sub-divided if there are too many entries in that lot.
10. **All judging of Horticulture and Crops, Departments 21- 29, will be done on Tuesday, July 23.**
11. If an exhibit is improperly entered, the superintendent or Flower Show Chair reserves the right to correct.
12. **The usual ribbons will be awarded for professional arrangements, but no cash premiums will be paid.**
13. Concerning Department 27, Classes 110 and 120: These must have been grown by exhibitor, in same container, at least 3 months prior to the County Fair.
14. Please provide the name of the variety on entry tags, where applicable.

1. Where possible, long uniform stems are best.
2. Foliage, healthy and free of injury, should be left on. Remove foliage below the water line. No foliage needed for pansies/violas.
3. Blooms should be as uniform in size, shape and color as possible and true to type.
4. Be sure to have the correct number of blooms as listed – no more or no less. A bloom is an individual flower on a stem.
5. Bloom should be near or "at peak", never over-bloomed for best exhibit. Cut off dead blossoms and seed heads.
6. Know the variety name.
7. Do not remove Lily Stamens

DEPARTMENT 28 – FLOWER ARRANGEMENTS

General Rules:

1. Design must be sole work of exhibitor.
2. Flowers and greens in arrangements may be home grown and/or purchased for arrangements.
3. No dried or artificial flowers, fruit or foliage may be used in arrangement or as accessories except where specified. Painted materials may be used in dried arrangements only.
4. Bases, mats and accessories are allowed in or with all arrangements.
5. Open to an interested exhibitor
6. Exhibitors are encouraged to enter multiple lots in their Class to make the show a success; **but only one entry per lot.**
7. No natural birds' nests, stuffed birds, butterflies, other insects or animals are permitted in a flower show. No noxious weeds such as purple loosestrife, thistles, and nightshade, or endangered plant material such as wild Orchids or wild lilies may be used.
8. Due to time and space limitations, assisted staging may be necessary.
9. Entries shall not exceed 24 inches in width except where noted.
10. Definitions of exhibitors as follows:
 - a. Junior: Exhibitor who is 18 years of age or younger.
 - b. Novice: Exhibitor who has not been awarded a blue ribbon at a previous flower show.
 - c. Advanced: Exhibitor who is of Amateur status, plus who has previously received Champion or Reserved Champion design awards as Amateur or previous flower shows.
 - d. Professional: Anyone who is currently or has been employed in the business of creating floral design sold of profit.
11. Professional arrangements will be judged by MSHS standards, in addition to the following: More emphasis than usual must be placed on theme development. The arrangement should evoke an idea, emotion, mood or story consistent with the stated topic. The judged will also seek out the aesthetic value of an arrangement over another if it arouses more interest and gives more pleasure. Harmony, beauty, expression and distinction are key elements in judging the professional designs.
